The event has evolved over the centuries but those roots are still there, and the day still prompts some questionable practices.

Then there's the issue of real pagans and witches. It's not uncommon today to meet people, including some teenagers, who call themselves pagans, wiccans or witches. Yet whether they realize it or not, they are tampering with spiritual forces that are not kind, although they might seem to be. These forces are also not from God.
